Priorities in 2021 & Beyond

- During 2020 the number of people in D-Groups was lower than the previous year, down to approximately 50% of our church membership.
 Many of these had to move to zoom or other online platforms during 2020.
- We would love to see D-Group membership increase to 75% of church membership in the coming years.
- Establish discipling relationships in line with Titus 2 (older/younger. Moving towards 30% of our members in a 1-1 discipling relationship.
- Enhancing our Mens and Womens Ministry with the appointment of D-Group overseers and regular discipleship events for these demographics.
- The D-Group Challenge. We would like to challenge every D-Group to see at least one guest joining a Christianity Explored course in Term 3.
- Relaunching "Have-a-Chat" to have a more obvious mission and discipleship focus in its gatherings.

We would like to thank you all, for accepting us as family members of the church. May God bless the church and a day comes when we will see the all the seats in the service to be full. Amen.


